In Memory of Kelen Harding

Last month our church lost a devoted and faithful employee. Helen Harding passed away on October 16, 2014. She served our church and church office for over 14 years. We surely will miss her.

Helen had this wonderful way of doing her job and making it look incredibly easy even when stress, detail and deadlines got in the way. We never really knew all of the things Helen did until she would be gone for a few days and then, when someone would come in and ask about a project, we would mostly say, "Not sure, I think Helen was in charge of that."

Helen was always here and on time. ALWAYS. If it was her turn to open the church office, we knew she would be here and usually plenty early. There were so many days when we could tell that she was hurting or exhausted or ill, but she never let on that she was anything but "just fine." She fooled us – some of the time; but as her health challenges began to get the best of her, and even when we began to notice that her breath was a little shorter and her eyes a little less bright, she carried on as if nothing was bothering her at all. We are pretty sure that she loved working in the church office because she usually took the opportunity to work extra hours, even on holidays.

Her loyalty was unmatched. She was Catholic, and very faithful to her church, attending every Saturday afternoon; however she was always so respectful of our Presbyterian way of doing things here. She consistently (and sometimes insistently!) made sure that our liturgy and our prayers met the criteria and theology for the Presbyterian Church (USA). She attended our Sunday services when there was a special event and in fact, had planned to attend the Pastor Appreciation Sunday service and annual church picnic. Sadly, it wasn't meant to be.

One of the things we knew we could count on was Helen's honesty and trustworthiness. Handling money was sometimes a necessary part of her job and we always knew that the funds were safe with her. She took over the treasurer's job last year and helped with the installation of the new in-house accounting system. When our CPA firm no longer produced the payroll checks, they began to be generated out of the church office. Since protocol requires that the pay checks be signed by someone other than staff, it was very important to her that everyone knew that she wasn't signing those checks anymore ONLY because of the protocol and not because of any reflection upon her honesty or integrity. She knew how important trust and honesty are in a church setting, and her actions never gave us any reason to question her integrity.

If you wanted to confide in Helen, the information was held completely confidentially. There was never even a doubt that your secrets were safe with her. She carried an endless treasure of confidences that were never divulged. If information needed to be passed on in the church office, we never hesitated to trust Helen with it. She was a safe keeper when it was to be kept confidential.

Helen was a tiny woman in stature, but her shoes will be enormous to fill. In fact, they will probably never be filled because Helen Harding can never be replaced.

May you rest in peace, dear friend, we will miss you.


And then Elijah commanded the people of God to fill four barrels of water and pour it over the altar. He had them do this four times.
