A Day Away in a Quiet Place

Maya Angelou said, "Each person deserves a day away in which no problems are confronted, no solutions searched for. Each of us needs to withdraw from the cares which will not withdraw from us." Similarly, when Jesus' disciples were consumed with ministry, he urged them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest" (Mark 6:31, NIV).

The late days of summer might be just the time to seek "a day away" not only from problems but even from ministry. While serving God and others can be energizing, we must balance work with rest. God set that example, resting after creating the world; Jesus set that example, calling his disciples away - not just alone, but with him to be refreshed.

Spend a relaxing day at a lake. Go on a scrapbooking retreat or a leisurely hike with friends. Find a monastery that welcomes guests, and experience 48 hours of prayer and silence there. Invite Jesus into that time and space. And remember another message he shared:

Do you know someone who is unchurched, or maybe is not attending church right now. Maybe it is someone who has been looking for a church home and has just not found the right place to worship. "We are a welcoming church!" I hear this all the time. Why not reach out to someone, extend the hospitality beyond the front doors. Read our Mission Statement which is printed in the Sunday morning worship bulletin each week. It says we are to reach out to people of all ages. We are to TRUMPET the GOOD NEWS we share of God's love and forgiveness. What a story! What an opportunity! Wouldn't it be interesting if we designated August as "bring a FRIEND TO CHURCH month. I wonder what would happen. Would we see new faces? Would we be sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ to those outside our own church community? Who knows! Try it, you might like it!

DID YOU KNOW? Our average worship attendance on Sunday mornings is between 51 and 56. According to our church records we have 82 people who are members of First Presbyterian Church. Of those 82 members, 14 are either shut-ins who are not able to attend worship or have moved. In doing the math we can figure we have about 65 to 68 members who are able to worship on a regular basis. Averaging out the numbers we are averaging over 65% attendance. **That is remarkable**! For our size and numbers we ARE doing some good ministries here at First Presbyterian. I want to thank you all for your efforts as we serve the Lord and our community. And, I am most certain that the Lord also appreciates and blesses all of what we do. Our future is uncertain as to how we are going to be served in pastoral leadership. It is imperative that you attend our congregational meeting on August 25 as we discern where we go from here. There are options. There are different directions we can take in how we continue serving the Lord here at First Presbyterian. Be there!

So unless a hymn is in our hymnal or in Public Domain and since we do not have copyright privileges, then we cannot reproduce it to use as an insert in our Sunday worship service.

Now you may be thinking.... "I have seen the song I requested in the bulletin before," and you may have. However, we now have a better understanding of our legal and moral Christian obligation in regard to the use of someone's copyrighted music. We appreciate your participation in our summer music selections and your understanding of how and why these selections are made.
