Change Your Spot



In the Old Testament, Jeremiah becomes so disgusted with his people's unfaithfulness and idolatry that he almost believes they can't change. He wonders whether a leopard can change its spots.

When a Sunday school teacher posed that question, one student pondered before replying, "Yes..If he doesn't like the spot he's in, he can change it."

Jeremiah reached a similar conclusion: His people could change their evil ways — their "spots" — if they chose to. "You can do good who are accustomed to do evil," he says (Jeremiah 13:23, NRSV). As another prophet later notes, God has shown us "what is good ... To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8, NIV). What spot — or spots — can you change?



Update on calling a new pastor:

Several points to make in helping you know and understand where First Presbyterian Church is in determining the future of pastoral leadership here at First:

- [1] The survey on the potential giving of members that was done back in September of this year yielded a potential total monthly offering of approximately \$7250. This is what you as members of our church said you would support for the ongoing ministry of our church. That number represents about \$87,000 annual giving. At present our annual income needed to meet the expenses as well as doing ministry is \$104,000. Needless to say, we are far short of the income needed to meet expenses for the year. These numbers also reflect the reality that we are not able meet our current expenses and continue to pay Pastor Clark's monthly salary of \$2908. There are two solutions to this situation: (1) there needs to be an increase in offerings or (2) we continue to use our reserves until they are depleted. This is a decision that you as members of First Presbyterian Church have to make.
- [2] The Session met in October with Rev. D.C. Adams who is our representative on the Committee on Ministry of the Arkansas Presbytery. Rev. Adams concluded from our financial report that we are very limited as to who might be available for a pastoral call. Compensation is the big issue. There are very few clergy available that are able and willing to serve on a part time basis, and with the limited resources we are able to offer. The reality is it could be a long, long wait!

It is important that you as members of the body of Christ here at First Presbyterian be kept informed of our situation. The Committee on Ministry is aware of our situation and will continue to be on the look out for possible candidates for our church. They, the Presbytery, cares about us and they want us to be a viable Presbyterian presence here in Mountain Home. As I mentioned earlier, there is a very limited supply of clergy seeking part time calls. We should continue to keep in our daily prayers God's guidance and direction in finding a clergy to serve the Lord here. *Pastor Clark*
