From the Pastor:

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ,

Wow! What a journey we find ourselves on. Things have changed dramatically since the last Redbud. I find myself in the electronic age more so than I ever thought I would be. Unable to shake hands, hug people, make normal home visits, all has changed my life, and I must say, "not for the good". As was mentioned in last Sunday's message, we are all grieving in one way or another, sometimes in more than one way. In some places one has to have a COVD19 test before they can even see their doctor. NO more coffee chatters with friends. And so the list goes on. Much has changed in the last month. I am pleasantly pleased to see how many people are honoring the request to voluntarily stay at home as much as possible. I do believe that will make a difference in how quickly we recover from this crisis.

I grieve the thought that we will not be able to be together in the flesh, as a church family on Easter Sunday, one of the most important and meaningful days in our church year. And yet, the electronic age has at least provided us with a way to worship together, apart. And we can celebrate that opportunity.

I sense from everything I hear this journey could be long lasting. It is important that we as a body of Christ stay connected. Things we can do to stay connected: [1] call a couple of friends each day; [2] write a note to someone you know; [3] if you have email and the internet send a note to someone in your church family letting them know you are thinking about them. (there is a list of most of our church members' email addresses in the back pages of our church directory). Stay in touch! Take care of yourself. Go for walks. Do some simple exercises in your home to stay fit. Jan and I dug out an old Nordic track exercise machine we had stored in the garage. At least we can get some good cardio workouts. Eat well.

And finally, stay in touch with the Lord. Pray daily. Set a time each day when you can focus on a conversation with God. Tell God your worries, your fears, your anxieties, God will understand and listen, like Jesus did in the resurrection of Lazarus in John 11.

We will get through this crisis. I truly believe that fact. It might take a bit longer than we would want it to. And, things might be a bit different than what we know today. But, I am certain we will make it through this crisis for the better. Our struggle right now is that we do not know what that difference will be. And that is part in parcel why we grieve. Take your griefs to God. God will listen. Stay in touch. I will be checking on our members from time to time by phone. For those of you who have email check it regularly as I will be sending out emails from time to time. And be sure to check into the website for our Sunday morning worship videos each week. We can worship together apart. Reminder: the website address is www.fpcmh.net. That takes you directly to the web page. I want to say a special thank you to Kristi for her gift of computer skills and her tenacity in figuring out how to solve the electronic issues we have faced this week. Without her skills and gifts we would not be this far along in staying touch.

Finally, even though we show the worship helpers, communion teams, etc., we will not be needing any of these ministries until further notice.




CONGRATULATIONS CONNIE!

Best of luck and God's Blessings for your life adventures in Texas!





Our new office secretary is Mrs. Kristi Nelson. Kristi is married to Tim Nelson and they have one son, Noah.


Her husband Tim is the elementary music teacher at Nelson-Wilks-Herron Elementary School in Mountain Home. Noah is a recent
