


All Workers Are Essential

The concept of vocation, Latin for "to call," previously referred only to a calling to church work. But Martin Luther emphasized the importance– and even sanctity– of all types of labor. The reformer pointed out that "God doesn't need our good works, but our neighbor does."

RJ Grunewald, in a blog post titled "God Makes Pizza," describes how this looks today: "God is busy about His work in the midst of your work whether you realize it or not."

The laundry, the spreadsheets, the phone calls and the cups of coffee are all deeply spiritual because God is at work in the world. He is serving your family, your co workers and your community through the work you do. God is at work providing 'daily bread' through the work that you do, no matter what work that you do, no matter what that work is."



Here's a behind the scenes look at how virtual worship has changed our "normal."

The following are the general steps we take to produce the virtual worship service each week:

[1] The worship bulletin is completed by Wednesday, prior to video taping. (Requiring all announcements and music selections to be in to the office by Wednesday noon)

[2] Multiple bulletins are printed by 9 am Thursday, including special directions for our "camera crew."

[4] Prior to everyone's arrival, the video camera (Pastor Clark's camera on his laptop) is set up and adjusted in the sanctuary.

[4] The lighting in the church is adjusted, air conditioning turned on by 9 am to make it comfortable for video taping (Especially in the heat of the summer!)3] The reader, organist, and singers arrive by 10:30am (This is the day of video taping)

[5] Video taping the service requires about 6 people including the pastor, organist, singers and lay reader who must be socially distanced and wear masks unless speaking.

[6] Following the video taping of the worship service there is a separate video taping of the special music, if done by the choir, which requires additional adjustments.

[7] The Pastor's laptop is given to Kristi, our office secretary, to be downloaded onto a flash drive to be uploaded onto her personal drive on her home computer. (????) *** all this takes about 2.5 to 3 hours to complete

[8] On Saturday Kristi's husband Tim, takes all the video taped "stuff" and somehow puts it all together into a meaningful worship experience. This includes dubbing in the ensemble, when applicable, or dubbing in Karen Diers special music. This is all done by Tim at no expense to us, the church. We are so thankful that he is willing to help us out.

[9] After the video is processed, it then travels to the FPCMH's YouTube Channel where it is produced for website viewing. (This is a slow process)

[10] The video is then uploaded to the church website, hopefully before the sun rises on Sunday morning!

We do realize it is not the most professionally done recording, as we are amateurs! However, we do not have to purchase camera equipment. We do not have to find someone to run the camera or buy equipment to video. If anyone is willing to take over the videotaping & processing of the online worship service, please contact the office or Pastor Clark.





<u>Guidelines and Rules to Reopen Church</u> <u>for Worship</u>

The following list of guidelines and rules to reopen church for "in house" worship was created by Barb Sandberg, Kay Kunkel and Pastor Clark according to the CDC guidelines for churches. It was reviewed and approved by the Session at their June meeting.

1) All church entrances will be locked except the two entrances to sanctuary.

* PLEASE use only those two entrances on Sundays.

- Upon entering for worship each person's temperature will be checked by someone at the entrance. * If temperature is over 99 degrees you will be asked to leave.
- 3) As you enter you will be given a worship bulletin and a form to complete letting us know you attended worship on that date. Please complete and deposit in container as you leave. This is important if there is a need for contact tracing.
- 4) A hand sanitizer dispenser will be placed at each entrance. We ask you use the hand sanitizer as you enter.
- 5) All hymnals and Bibles will be removed from pews for safety sake.
- 6) Pews marked with a streamer will be the pews you may sit in. (Only every other pew.)
- 7) You are asked to sit six feet apart in the pew. Maximum of three people to a pew. Exception: couples or family members sitting together.
- 8) Pews will be numbered with a sign on each pew. Pews on east side of sanctuary will be numbered with odd numbers. Pews on the west side of the sanctuary will be even numbered pews.

9) Dismissal following worship: Ushers will dismiss from back to front. We ask that you keep six feet apart as you leave. The east side of the sanctuary will exit to the outside aisle and leave through the front doors. The west side of the sanctuary will exit by the side aisle and exit through the courtyard door. <u>Please honor six foot distancing as you leave worship.</u>

10) Please do not enter the Fellowship Hall. There will be **NO** fellowship time either before or after worship.

11) Offering: There will be offering plates placed at each entrance where you may place your offerings or as before, you may mail in your offerings.

12) Masks **MUST** be worn during your time in worship. Please bring your mask or we will have masks available at the door for you.
