
SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Holiday Favorites

"This was a 'must have' in Bud's family for years. After Bud's mom died nobody claimed the three tin boxes of recipes, so I asked for them. I felt like a thief in the night, but was secretly pleased when nobody claimed them!" - Barb

GRASSHOPPER PIE– Barb & Bud Hough

Ingredients

24 Oreos crushed in a food processor– not "double stuff" 1/3 cup butter, melted

Directions:

Mix well and then press into the bottom & up sides of a 9 in. pie pan.

Reserve 1/4 cup of the mixture for a garnish on top.

Mix 1/4 cup crème de menthe with one 7 oz. jar of marshmallow cream (or substitute with 1/4 cup of milk & 10 drops of green food coloring & a few drops of peppermint flavoring.) Fold this mixture into 2 cups of heavy whipping cream, not the canned type.

Pour into prepared pie pan & smooth top. Sprinkle with the reserved crumbs on top. Freeze overnight. This heavenly rich dessert goes a long way and it is festive and pretty.

BRANDIED CRANBERRY RELISH– Ralph & Karen Gillespie

If you have ever wondered what to do with fresh raw cranberries, here it is. This has become a staple at our Thanksgiving meals for a lot of years. Copied from the Wisconsin State Journal, Madison Wisconsin 11/19/1970

Four cups (1 pound) fresh cranberries

One medium orange

One cup sugar One fourth cup brandy



Pick over cranberries, turn into colander and wash under cold running water; drain. Pour one cup of the berries into an electric blender.

Wash orange; do not peel. Halve orange and remove seeds; cut each half into eight wedges. Put four of the wedges into the blender with the berries. Run on high speed until fairly coarsely chopped; stop and start blender as necessary, pushing un -chopped fruit toward the blades as necessary.


(If the blender has a chop setting use that setting for the chopping.) Turn into a bowl. Chop the remaining berries and orange mixture the same way using one cup of berries and four orange wedges each time. When all the fruit has been chopped stir in the sugar and brandy. Cover tightly and refrigerate from overnight to one week to allow flavors to blend and mellow. Relish may be stored in refrigerator for several weeks.

Yield: About three cups, enough for 12 to 16 servings.

Note: This makes a quite tart relish. If you want it sweeter, add one-half cup of sugar which will increase the yield to about three and one-third cups.

Pecan Tassies– Jan Clark

One 3 oz. pkg. cream cheese 1/2 cup butter 1 cup sifted flour 1 egg 3/4 cup brown sugar 1 Tbsp. butter 1 tsp. vanilla Dash of salt 2/3 cup broken pecans

Allow cream cheese, butter and egg to warm to room temperature. Blend cream cheese and butter. Cut in flour and chill slightly. Shape into 24 one–inch balls. Place into tiny ungreased muffin tins. Press dough onto bottoms and sides of cups of muffin tins.

PECAN FILLING

Beat together egg and brown sugar. Add butter, vanilla and salt. Mix until smooth. Place one-half of the pecans into the crusts. Fill crusts with the filling. Top with the remaining pecans. Bake at 325 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes.

TECH TIP

How to Email a Photo From Your iPhone. (Any type of smart phone should be able to email photos.)

- 1. Go to the "photos" app. (The place where your photos are stored on your phone.)
- 2. Select the photo you wish to email.
- 3. While viewing the photo, touch the icon in the lower left corner of the screen. (The white box with an arrow.)
- 4. Choose the Email photo button.
- 5. Enter the To: address. To send a picture to the church you would type **fpcmh@centurytel.net** in the address box.
- 6. Enter a subject ("Holiday pics".) A preview of the picture will appear in the email body.
- 7. Press Send in the upper right hand corner of the screen. It is an upward pointing arrow.
