TIME FOR A FRESH START

As we all start reclaiming our "normal" routines and schedules, it is important that we take time to remember to update important emergency information. Mari Ruegsegger sent a message to Pastor Clark asking him to remind us all to update our next of kin contacts & medical information. Whether you keep your emergency information in the glove compartment of your car, your purse or wallet, or in another secure place in your home, check to be sure that this information is current and easy to find!

Update your primary care physician's information and any specialists you see. Have a list of medications you currently take and any other important medical information. An updated living will with your wishes known and witnessed and your emergency contacts' phone numbers need to be current. Family members' telephone numbers need to be updated so that they could be contacted in case you were in an accident. If you use any kind of "smart phone" many people will put the letters "ICE" - in case of emergency next to the name of their emergency contact.

Mari told of neighbors that were traveling to Illinois for Christmas. They were hit by an ambulance while traveling on ice. Their car was split in half with debris landing in trees and water. The only way they were able to track down family members was from a church bulletin. They contacted the church in Mountain Home and a fellow church member went to the hospital to be with the women until family could make it to the hospital. One of the women passed away shortly after arriving, but her family was able to be contacted quickly and be with her, thanks to the church bulletin.

Take some time today and update your medical information & your personal contact lists! Be sure to tell your emergency contacts where you keep your medical information. It will only take a few minutes......you are worth it!!
