Samaritans' Purse Christmas Shoebox Time!

It is time to begin planning for the **Samaritan's Purse Christmas shoeboxes!** The shoebox project will start on Friday, October 1st, 2021 and end on Sunday, November 8th, 2021.

This year you will have <u>three different options</u> for participating in the Shoebox program.

- You may pick up an empty Samaritan's Purse shoebox at the church and also information sheets you can use to help you choose the right items to fill the box with. Certain items cannot be mailed, and certain items an encouraged for boys/girls and different age groups. You will need to include a payment of \$9.00 to pay for the shipping of your shoebox. Please make sure to mark your shipping payment with "shoebox" so it can be routed to the correct account by the counters.
- 2. Again this year, if you would like to <u>donate \$25.00</u> to have someone from First Presbyterian create a box for you, please let Mary Smith know. Make SURE to <u>mark your donations</u> with "SHOEBOXES" so that the counters can route the money to the appropriate place. A volunteer will then shop for you and fill your box. The shipping fee will be included in the \$25.00.
- 3. There is a <u>brand new way</u> to participate called <u>Build a Shoebox Online</u>. You can give boys and girls in need a gift-filled shoebox packed from your computer or handheld device. In just a few clicks, you can select toys and other fun items to include as well as a letter and photo of yourself if you'd like. Samaritan's Purse will pack and ship your shoebox to children all over the world. First Presbyterian Church has it's very own web page that you can get to through a special link. This web page link is now available on our church website, or can be sent to you via email by contacting the church office.

Samaritans' Purse Christmas Shoebox Time cont.

From your computer or tablet you will click on this special link and be taken to a page with a picture of the church and a brief paragraph explaining our goal, and a button to press that says **"Build a Shoebox Online Now."**

You will then have the option to choose **"Start Building"** or **"Build It For Me."**

If you choose "**Start Building**" you will then choose a boy or a girl, an age range, and you will be able to drop in the shoebox essential items, and special gift items just by pushing the select buttons. You will have the option to add a note to your child, or not. It will give you the chance to build another box, or to go to the checkout. You will need a credit card to pay the \$25.00 fee for the box. This fee includes all shipping and handling. I found the process very easy to follow, and I'm sure you will too.

You may just simply want Samaritan's Purse to build a box for you. You will simply choose **"Build It For Me"** and then proceed to the checkout. You will <u>not</u> need to choose the items, or the child's age or gender.

More specific information will be coming in the October Redbud, as well as in the weekly church worship bulletins. Since this is a new method, you will be able to start making online shoeboxes as soon as you would like. The link to the shoebox program is now on the opening page of the FPC website.

So- you can choose to shop til' you drop and build your own shoebox, returning it to FPC to ship; send \$25.00 to the church in an envelope marked "shoeboxes" and a volunteer from the church will do the shopping for you; or you can use technology and build a box using your computer from your own home!

Whichever way you choose- the Mission committee is here to help!

First Presbyterian's Shoebox goal is 125 boxes by the deadline of November 8th, 2021. All 3 ways count towards reaching our goal!!

We can't wait to see the shoeboxes start to stack up at the church.
