

Why not try this delicious cake this holiday season while also spending some time with your Bible! To find the ingredients to add you'll need to look up the listed scripture verses. The ingredients will be listed on page 7 (Underneath the scripture readings )of the RedBud in case you get stumped!

This clever cake recipe was submitted by Marilyn Seel.

#### SCRIPTURE CAKE

1.) 4 1/2 cups of 1 Kings 4:22

2.) 1 cup of Judges 5:25

3.) 2 cups of Jeremiah 6:20

4.) 2 cups of 1 Samuel 30:12

5.) 2 cups of Nahum 3:12

6.) 2 teaspoons of Amos 4:5

7.) 2 cups of Numbers 17:8

8.) 2 tablespoons of 1 Samuel 14:26

9.) 1 pinch of Leviticus 2:13

10.) 6 of Jeremiah 17:11

11.) 1/2 cup of Judges 4:19

Seasoning to taste

12.) 2 Chronicles 9:9

To mix, follow the directions of Solomon for bringing up a child in *Proverbs 23:14*. Bake the cake in loaf pans at 325 degrees for about 50 minutes. Turn on a rack to cool. Slice after a few hours.

A pinch of salt is about 18 grains. (from Dr. Chase's recipes of 1886)

This particular recipe is based on the Revised Standard Version of the Bible but others have been taken from the King James Version.

This is a white fruit cake, less sweet than most and slices beautifully when cold to serve with tea.

It may be topped with a very thin sugar icing dribbled over the surface.


