

What is the Twin Lakes Literacy Council?

The Twin Lakes Literacy Council is a non-profit organization of volunteers working to improve literacy in Baxter County. We provide one-on-one tutoring to people who need better reading, writing, English or math skills. Literacy council volunteers provide tutoring to..

- Adults who have low literacy levels- that is, they cannot comprehend material beyond a fourth grade level.
- People working towards their G.E.D. diplomas
- College students having trouble with math or English classes
- Children who need one-on-one help at school
- Adults learning algebra, geometry, and computer skills
- New immigrants learning to speak English as a Second Language
- Mentally impaired adults who need to learn basic skills
- Immigrants who would like to study for the citizenship exam
- Adults and 16-17 year olds needing financial literacy or workplace skills.

How did we get here?

Twin Lakes Literacy Council began in 1986 and was housed in a former funeral parlor with two volunteers, zero funding and donated materials from North Arkansas College in Harrison. Our organization is currently made up of 51 volunteers– 36 tutors and 15 volunteers who help the organization.

How much do lessons cost?	They are free to the student!		
How often are lessons?	Lessons are typically one hour,		
	once or twice a week.
