HOLY COMMUNION IN APRIL AND MAY

Holy Communion distribution for April and May will be different. At the March Session meeting it was decided to try Communion distribution by what we call "continuous table." We will not be receiving the small communion sets with wafer and grape juice. No more having to peel back the cellophane seals.

The blessing of the elements- bread and juice will take place. You will then be invited to come forward down the center aisle. The pastor and a communion assistant will offer you the bread and juice. The person offering the bread will wear a plastic glove and place the wafer in your hand. You will then proceed to the cup and take an individual cup from the tray. You will then return to your seat. We will ask the west side to commune first then the east side.

If you ARE NOT ABLE to come forward the pastor and assistant will bring you communion in the pew. We ask that if you are not able to come forward please sit on an aisle seat. That makes is easier to administer the communion.

I realize this is a completely different way of receiving Holy Communion! It is *NOT THE WAY WE USED TO COMMUNE!!!* The Session had several options to consider in ways to commune. There was a desire to do away with the individual communion sets. Accessing the parts of the set was difficult for many. Passing the Communion elements in the pew was a concern because it was possible to contaminate the elements, especially the bread, with the fear of the Covid virus still lingering in our world. Therefore, the Session felt the best and safest option at this time was by continuous table. PLEASE, be patient. Please- if you feel you cannot come forward we will bring Communion to you. We ask that you give it a fair chance. You might like it!

MISSION FOCUS FOR APRIL IS DISASTER BUCKETS

The next mission for FPC is the collection of materials to go inside disaster buckets that are sent to areas of the country dealing with clean up after natural disasters. <u>FPC's goal is to contribute 6 buckets</u>.

Items needed include: rubber gloves, bleach, rags or small towels, scrubbing brushes, batteries (all sizes), flashlights, drinking water and first aid kits. These items should fit inside a 5 gallon bucket with a lid that can be purchased at a local hardware store or Walmart.
